- 5 Supports expenses of the Presbytery Office. By voluntarily giving to this mission, everyone's Per Capita is lower.

D. DESIGNATED PRESBYTERY OFFICE SUPPORT

- 6 GP Resourcing of Congregations & Pastors: Salary, housing, travel, study leave and benefit plan dues for the General Presbyter and Administrative Assistant. Additional funds come from the Administrative Budget of Presbytery.
- ~~7 Media Resource Center: Office assistant's salary and media resources and resource information for churches, committees, teams and members of the Presbytery.~~
- 7 Office of the Presbytery: Support for coordinating, identifying and finding resources in the areas of Stewardship, Evangelism, Christian Education etc. as part of the work of the Presbytery's Office.

E. DESIGNATED MISSION GIVING

- 8 Christian Education Program: Support for the youth and educational programs throughout the presbytery especially those sponsored by the Committee of Presbytery Life.
- 9 Breezewood Truck & Traveler Ministry: Ecumenical ministry to truckers, travelers, and employees of business in Breezewood at the intersection of I-70, US 30 and the Pennsylvania Turnpike.
- ~~12 Church Transformation: Working with churches to help them become transformed or revitalized in their mission and ministry.~~
- 10 Krislund Camp Presbytery Support: (This was formerly called Program & Staff.) These funds support the programs and staff of the camp.
- ~~14 Krislund Funding the Future Capital Campaign (FTF): Krislund is still paying off its loans for land acquisition as well as other construction projects that have improved the facilities. Contributions to this cause are greatly appreciated.~~
- 11 Mission Interpreters: Receiving and sending persons who can help us become better informed about the mission of the Presbyterian Church (USA).
- 12 Pahk 5 Nan Partnership: These funds help train members of the Pahk to meet the demands of ministry, supplement various needs throughout the Pahk, provide for school children who are residents at Mercy House, and underwrite the costs of bringing members of the Pahk to visit our Presbytery. We covenant with the Pahk to send \$7,000 starting 2025.
- 13 Pahk 5 Nan Special Projects: These funds help with particular designated project within the Pahk.

- 14 Presbyterian Homes Chaplain Services: Services for persons in nursing and assisted living care facilities.

- 15 Presbyterian Homes Charitable Care: To assist residents who have outlived their funds and those on Supplemental Social Security. No resident of the Presbyterian Homes has ever been asked to leave due to inability to pay.

- 22 Presbyterian Homes Spring Offering: These funds support the work of the Homes' Auxiliaries, which provide both necessities and extra comforts to patients and staff. 22a Huntingdon, 22b Hollidaysburg
- 23 Presbyterian Homes Fall Offering: This offering goes to Presbyterian Senior Living in Dillsburg to support Charitable Care.
- 24 Huntingdon Presbytery Hunger Funds These funds are used to alleviate hunger and eliminate its causes, responding with compassion and justice to poor and hungry people in Huntingdon Presbytery through the Huntingdon Presbytery's Hunger Grants.
- 25 Pentecost Offering: (Congregation may keep 40%) This offering is used to support work on behalf of children at risk – WILL BE ELIMINATED IN 2026
- 26 Peace & Global Witness Offering: (Congregation may keep 25%) This offering is used for ministries of peace and reconciliation and to advocate for peace and justice in cultures of violence around the world and at home, through collaborative projects of education and Christian witness. – WILL BE ELIMINATED IN 2026
- 27 One Great Hour of Sharing Offering: These gifts share God's love with people experiencing need throughout the world and here at home. 36% World Hunger, 32% Presbyterian Disaster Assistance 32 % Self-Development of People.
- 28 Christmas Joy Offering: 50% of the receipts provide support to retired and active church workers and their families and the other 50% supports Presbyterian-related racial ethnic schools and colleges.
- 29 and 30R Disaster Relief: These monies are used to assist people during natural and manmade disasters. You may designate a particular disaster area.
